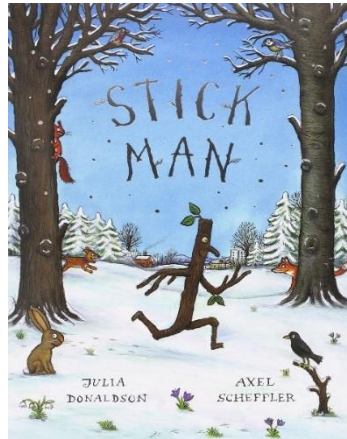
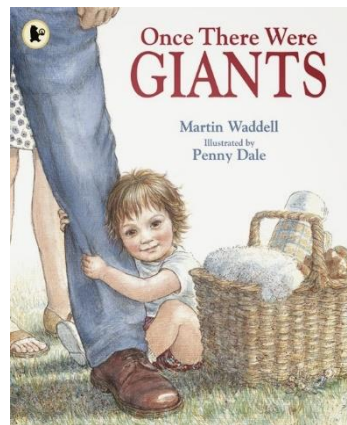

glass	Glass is a man-made material that is usually transparent and fragile.	
mammal	A mammal is an animal that breathes air, has a backbone, and grows hair at some point during its life.	 Horse Giraffe Fox
metal	Metal is a man-made material which is hard and shiny.	
plastic	Plastic is a man-made material that can be moulded and shaped into different things.	
waterproof	A waterproof material is something that keeps the water out. For example wellington boots are waterproof.	
wood	Wood is a hard natural material taken from trees.

KEY VOCABULARY

Spring

The season, **after winter**, when the temperature begins to rise, plants begin to grow and animals come out from hibernation

Summer

The **warmest season, coming after spring**, when the days are long because the sun rises earlier and sets later

Autumn

The season, **after summer, where the days get shorter**, crops can be harvested and the leaves begin to fall from the trees

Winter

The **coldest season**, trees are often bare and some animals hibernate; the days are shorter

Rain gauge

A tool used to **measure how much rain has fallen**

Thermometer

A tool used to **measure the temperature**

Weather Vane

A tool used to find out in **which direction the wind is blowing**

Data

A **collection of facts, often numbers**, that can give us information

Clouds

A cloud is a **collection of tiny droplets of water in the sky**; when the droplets fall they become rain

Flood

An **overflow of water**

Hurricane

A **powerful storm** with strong winds

Meteorologist

A scientist who **studies the weather**

Cirrus

white, thin and wispy



Cumulus

white, fluffy

grey, cover the whole sky

nose

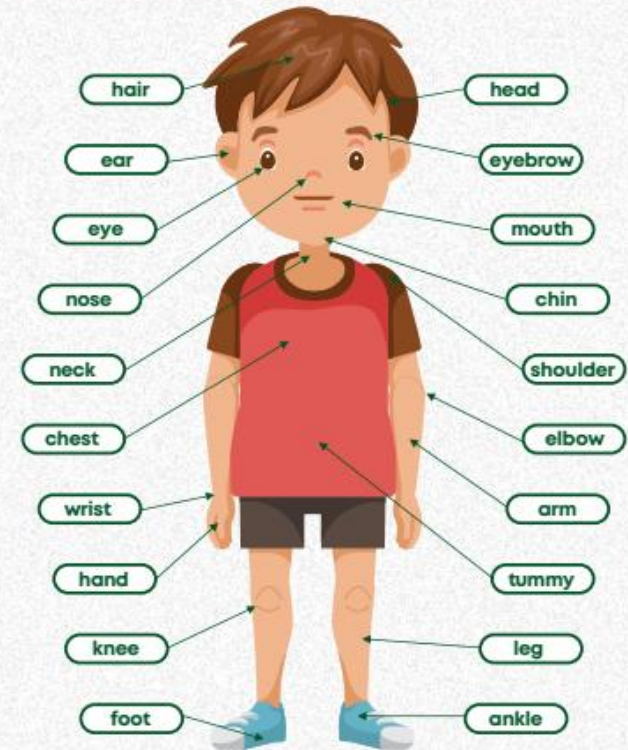
with our nose, we **smell**
